

All of our students that have gone to Oxford or Cambridge and nearly 90% of our students going to Russell Group Universities took the EBacc combination of subjects in Key Stage 4





April/May 2024	Confirmation of Choice Allocations A confirmation letter informing you and your parents/carers of the choices that have been allocated is sent home.
