- One “EBacc” Course

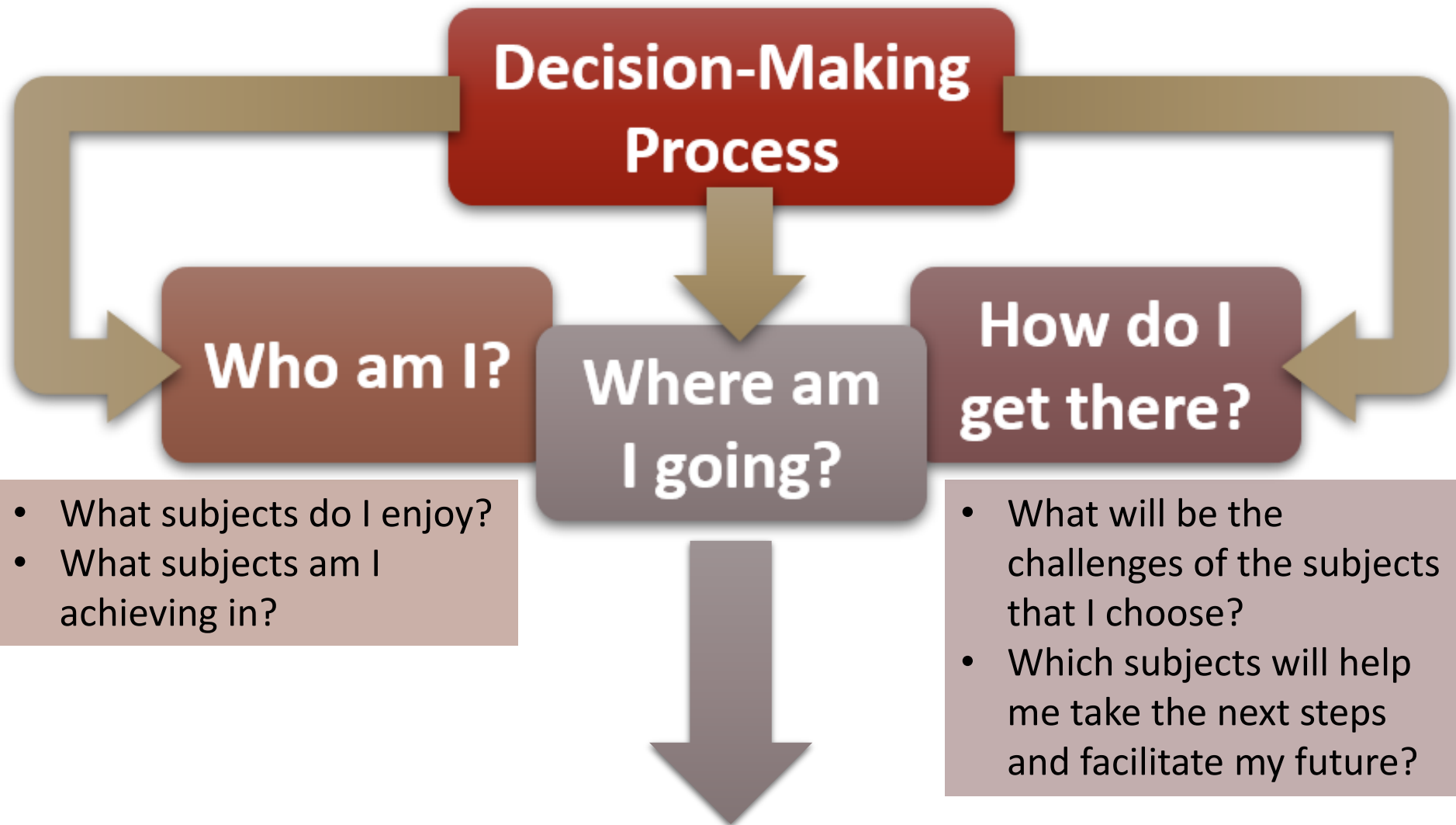

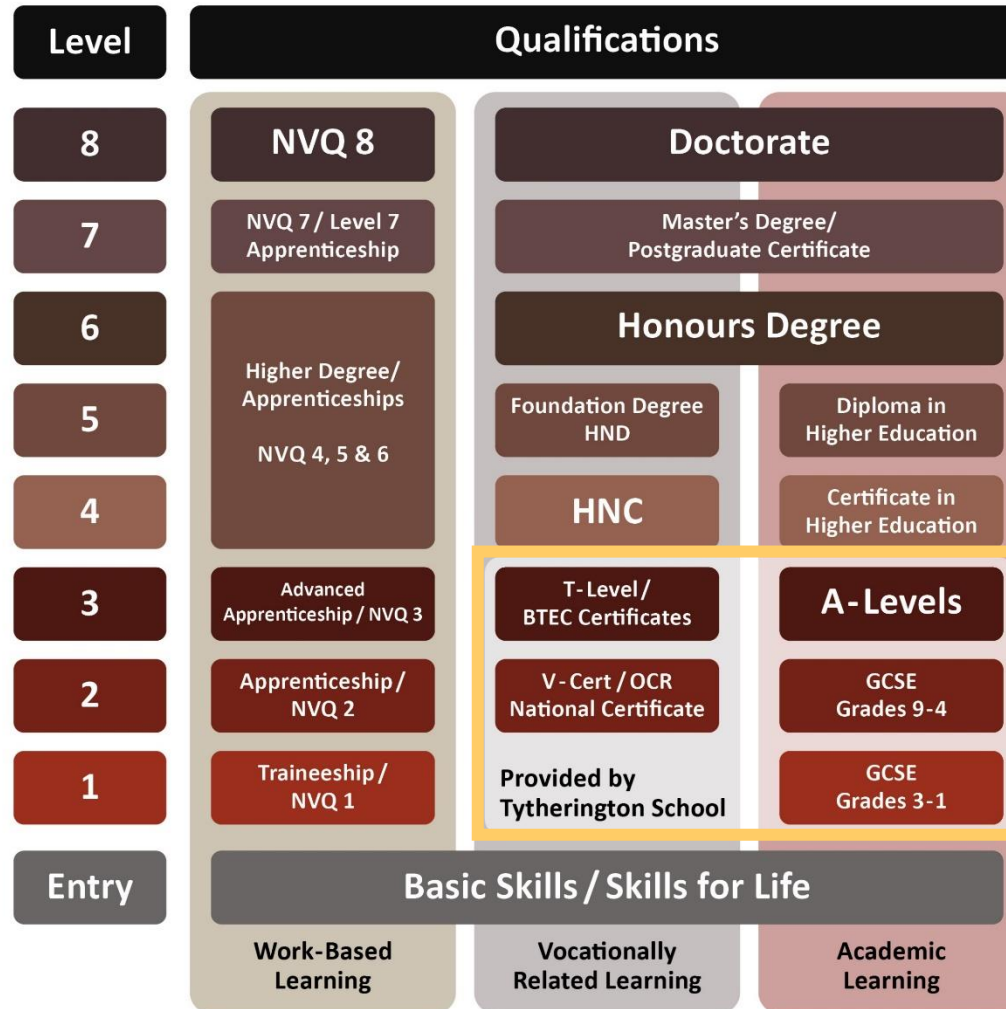

 - Please note that “Separate” Sciences take up one Additional Course slot

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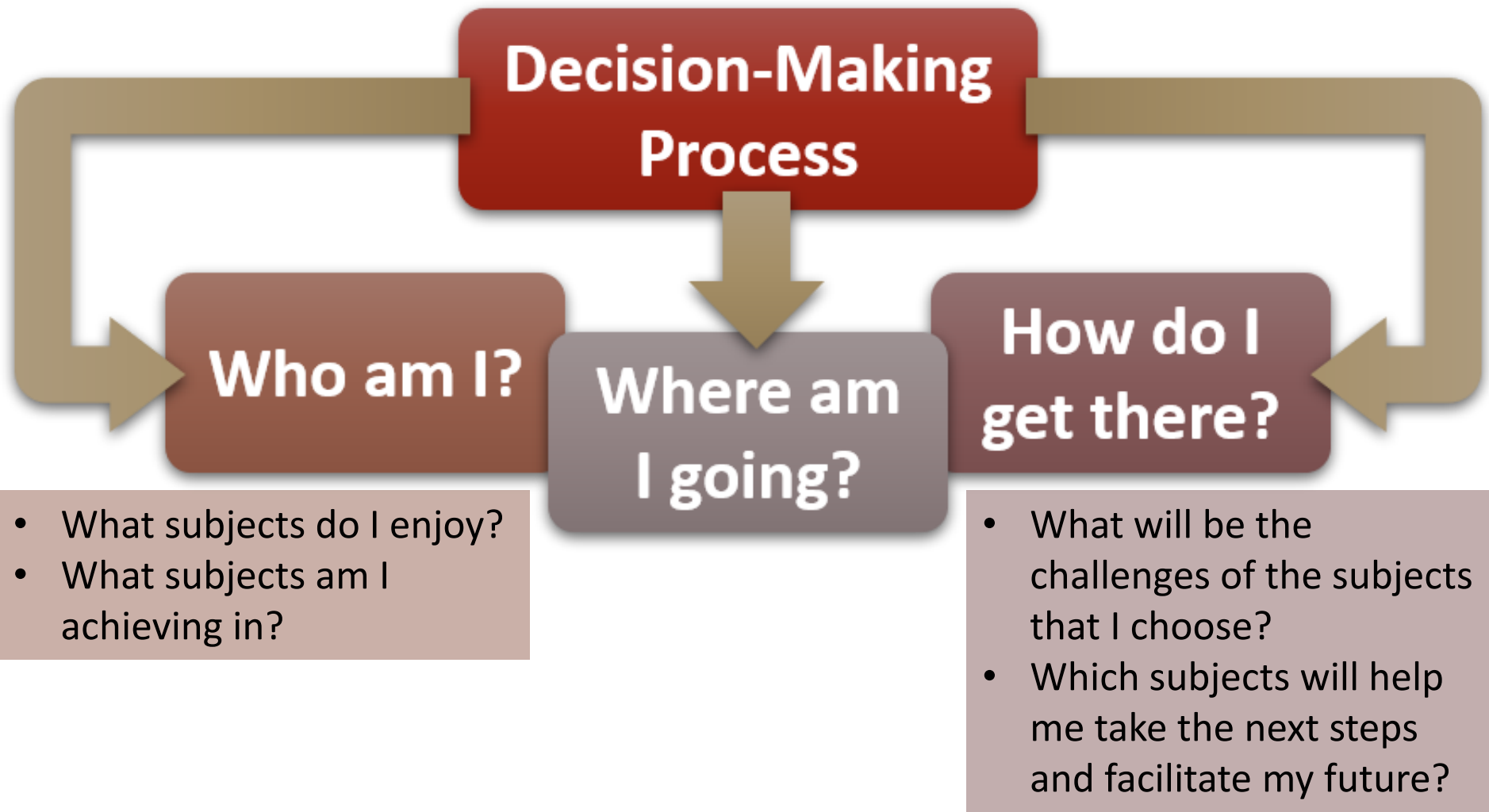

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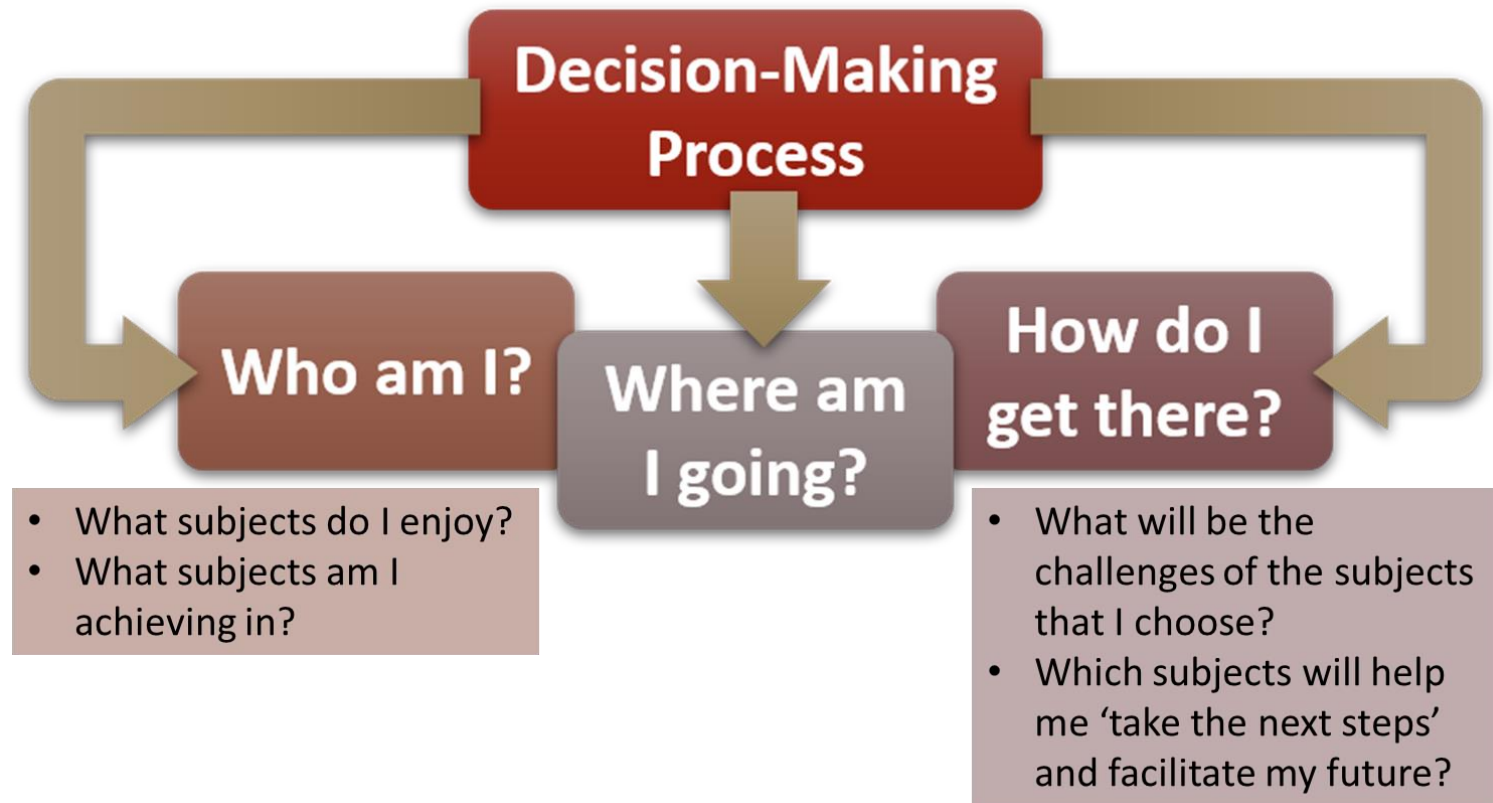
Other Key Dates in the Guided Choices Process

Monday 5th February 2024 7:45am – 6:00pm	Guided Choices Consultation Meetings (In Person, In School) A day that provides opportunity for parents and students to come into school for a guidance appointment to discuss and finalise their choices.
Friday 9th February 2024 By Midnight	Choices Form Submission Deadline (Online) Final date for submission of students' online "Year 9 Guided Choices".
March & April 2024	Guided Choices Review If additional consultations are required, they will take place between selected students and a senior member of staff before final allocations are confirmed.
April/May 2024	Confirmation of Choice Allocations A confirmation letter informing you and your parents/carers of the choices that have been allocated is sent home.
